PROJECT BACKGROUND

CIRCUMSTANCES THAT INFLUENCED MODEL FRIENDS INTERNATIONAL NAMIBIA

INTRODUCTION

Model Friends International is a mobile counselling organization with an unquenchable drive to see young people take the path of discipline and respect. Model Friends Projects has been successful in Nigeria, DRC, Zambia, USA, etc.

HEALTH

The minister of Health and Social Services, Richard Kamwi, recently warned in the Namibian newspaper "*Drug abuse in Namibia hits all –time high*".

The minister said that Namibia cannot allow herself to be turned into a drug consumer country and he called on every Namibian to act as a whistle blower against the seller and abusers of illicit substances.

In another development, The United Nation Acting Resident Co-ordinator, Joyce Mends-Cole also shared the minister's concerns. She under-lined that drugs abuse is threatening the developmental gain made since independence. The minister reiterated his concern that the women and children end up to suffer domestic violence due to these alcohol and drug abuse.

Recent Data of UNICEF Namibia

The UNICEF universal periodic review, in July, 2010 indicates that the HIV/AIDS epidemic is stabilising in Namibia, it remains a country with one of the highest prevalence rate globally at 17.8% prevalence amongst pregnant women and over 13% in general adult population. Of the new infections, an estimated 31% are among young people aged between 15to24years and 68% of these females. According to this data, women in Namibia are becoming infected.

SECURITY/PROTECTION

Violence denies women their human rights including the right to security, respect, personal development, growth, and dignity.

Shocking Police Investigation Report:

January 13, 2011, police investigation at the Rundu State Hospital recorded a shocking 447 teenage pregnancy case during 2010. This figure of 447 is only for

girls, aged 12 to 17 years who are below the age of consent. However, due to this pregnancy rate of underage girls, the police was prompted to investigate the cause.

Suicides in North and Rehoboth Soars

Suicides are continuing to spiral in the far North of Namibia with a total number higher than last year. Police statistics shows that from May 2010 up until January 2011, 58 people had died by their own hand by hanging or shooting themselves.

The records by NV IKEALUMBA and I.D COUPER from St. Mary's Hospital Rehoboth states that more than 46 underage teenagers of 10 to 20years (19 male and 27 female) committed suicides in Rehoboth in 2006.

EDUCATION

Shocking Revelation:

The minister of Education, Abraham Iyambo during his new year's address gave a shocking revelation. According to him, a total of 1,493 schoolgirls dropped out of school last year 2010 because of pregnancy and 31 teachers were recorded to have been responsible for some pregnancies. He further, said: 2011 will be "a year of recommitment, better education outcomes, mass drive and mobilisation".

According to Minister Iyambo, he said, "Namibia's education system finds itself at a crossroad." The decision of which direction and pace we will go is entirely in our hands. The minister said that Namibia needs, "An educational system to serve, to be respected, to create, and preserve what is good and noble."

SOCIAL

Although alcohol is a socially legalized substance. It is still a substance of abuse affecting young people. Study carried out in 2010 to determine the factors that contribute to learners dropping out of secondary school educational programme are due to the follow social problems:

- a. Alcohol, tranquilizers, and marijuana abuse,
- **b.** Lack of parental/ self-motivation,
- c. Teenage pregnancy,
- **d.** Difficulty to cope with studies due to emotional and serious psychological distress as a result of night works like night clubbing, staying awake to rob at night and prostitution.
- e. Chronic HIV/AIDS illness.

AIMS OF PROJECT

With this background, it shows that these problems have a wide impact, spreading to families and schoolmates who are affected in terms of psychological stress and low morale. The majority of suicides cases are signs of expectations not met in line of youth counselling and empowerment.

From our research, we discovered that the peak of suicides and attempted suicides by learners and school dropouts are outcomes of December and January grade 10 and 12 results. From this background, *Model Friends International considered all the factors associated with suicides and attempted suicides among young people to be emotional instability and mental psychological depressions resulting from alcohol, tranquilizers, substance abuse like marijuana and socioeconomic fear as unemployed dropped outs in the society.*

However, the alarming calls by the minister of education, minister of health and other government departments to assist in combating these problems, Model Friends International decided to take up the challenge to contribute her skills and 10years experience to the nation in the area of youth counselling.

Model Friends International goal is to act as early primary intervention, prevention counselling organization. The main motive is to deal with the above problems through the involvement of mobile family and communal counselling to encourage teenagers and school dropouts

BENEFIT:

This networking arrangement will prove to be extremely useful in sharing information, experience, and skills on how to deal with the problems and supporting government social workers with family and communal counselling and seminars.

Most people especially the young ones would not want to die voluntary yet more and more people are committing suicides in Namibia month by month. Our organizations knows that government youth social workers need great support for efficiency and are few in numbers compared to 42% of young people nationwide.

Model Friends International will provide vehicles and work force that will help Model Friends International project co-ordinators and government social workers to do follow up's and counselling in communities voluntary.

Extensive use of print and electronic media, banners, car stickers, T-Shirt, brochures, radio, television, talk shows, newspapers, calendars, community meetings and seminars focusing on how to develop young people's potential and talents.

INTERVENTION

CURRICULUM AND STRATEGY

CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT APPROACH

This approach is titled: 'MISSION TO SUPPORT" is a support programme based on the right of choice through counselling. The component teaches the importance of developing an attitude of public mindedness, unselfishness, self-control, not sex control. We also address the issue of pre-marital sexual activity, not just the rates of STD/HIV infections.

An African Traditional Proverb says: "Black goats must be caught early, before it is dark." Therefore, these young people should be taught when they are young.

Like the old African adage, "you can only bend a fish when it is fresh, because when it is dry you will destroy it"

- The goal of the intervention strategy of Model Friends International is to transform young people to possess good character in their relationships with the opposite sex.
- The roles and responsibilities of Model Friends International has been solely focused on dealing with wrong habits, actions and desires of young people that leads to greed, sexual lust and early teenage pregnancy
- The objective of Model Friends International is to establish mechanisms for the elimination of all forms of harmful traditional practices of young people committing suicides, murder, including drinking, smoking at early age.
- All HIV/AIDS international conferences urge the design, implementation and monitoring, of effective, efficient and mutually reinforcing programmes in all spheres of development, with the full participation of young and old people.

We hope that everyone, young and old will find this information helpful and take a decision to support our goal to stop this deadly virus and violent ways young people take their life by suicides through hanging and other violent means.

Objective 1:

Discussion about Character Development

Teenagers from the age of 12 upwards should be able to do the following:

30 Minutes * Complete an HIV/AIDS knowledge questionnaire

20 Minutes * List some of the steps necessary for a person to change character

15 Minutes * Identify the difference between Murder, Suicide and violence.

15 Minutes * List some problems experienced growing up with a single parent.

10 Minutes * Do young people need help in the area of bitterness growing up?

- Learners/school dropout's knowledge questionnaire
- Parent's knowledge questionnaire
- HIV/AIDS knowledge questionnaire

Knowledge Questionnaire:

These questionnaires are designed simply to measure the general knowledge and some prevailing attitudes about school dropouts and HIV/AIDS awareness. Ask teenagers and parents to answer all questions as honestly as possible, reminding them that no names will be written on the questionnaire. After they finish, collect the answered knowledge questionnaire and they submit to Model Friends International coordinators.




